Journal (4 – 25 point assignments = 100 points)

How to Complete the Journal

The journal is a problem solving assignment. There is no single, final and correct answer. I'm more interested in getting a sense of how you are learning. You will be graded on your ability to present and defend opinions by making judgments about information, validity of ideas or quality of work based on a set of criteria.

For the opportunity to create an outstanding answer it is critical that you make use of what you are learning from class such as with assignments, reading the textbook and articles, and various class activities, etc.), and apply them to the matter being evaluated. How did your learning then extend to your thinking in the effort to answer the question? Focus on a single theme or topic when you make a journal entry.



You must provide at least one source with your answer. The source must be cited properly using MLA style (using end notes) and a working link to the source must be included with your document. Including more than one source, doing more than the minimum, can have a positive impact toward an outstanding answer.

- 2) Can you assess the value or importance of ...?
- 3) What would you recommend...?
- 4) How would you compare the ideas...?
- 5) What choice would you have made...?
- 6) How would you justify...?
- 7) What would you cite to defend the actions...?
- 8) Based on what you know, how would you explain...?

Submit a typed document to your Google Drive folder (follow the directions for typed documents in your first- day handout) with an answer that is at least three but no more than six paragraphs in length. The question will be stated at the top of your document. Paragraphs that follow are dedicated to answering the question. Submit the folder to my jacobsccc@gmail. Proper spelling, grammar, etc. are expected and are part of the evaluation for the grade.
